BELIEVING WHAT WE SEE

DAILY REFLECTIONS by Catherine Upchurch

Readings: Acts 13:44-52; John 14:7-14

Scripture: All the ends of the earth have seen the saving power of God. (Ps 98:3)

Reflection: Several weeks ago, as we began the Easter season, we pondered together why some who saw the risen Jesus did not believe. Today's readings bring us to this question once again. In the Gospel reading from John, the apostles who ae gathered at the Last Supper are slow to catch on, still unsure whether Jesus is the Son of God. The scene from Acts reflects the period after Jesus' ascension, when many rejected the apostles' message about the resurrection of Jesus. The Psalmist proclaims, "All the ends of the earth have seen the saving power of God." So all have seen God at *work*, but perhaps not all are aware of what they are seeing. If we wish to know the power of God in our world, we must be humble enough to set aside any rigid thinking that would prevent our *sight* from becoming *insight*. We must be willing to look at our surroundings as if we've just gotten new lenses for our glasses. Do we see only what is occurring on the surface or do we look more deeply? Are we able to recognize when goodness is growing even if the "soil" that is producing the good doesn't seem to be an obvious place for growth? Are we willing to let God be God rather than molding God in our own image or according to our own preferences? The saving power of God is no limited to rare occasions of the miraculous. God's power is evident in the things we take for granted, like the wonders of nature and the ways our bodies change through the season of our lives. It is found in simple acts of service as well as profound moment of self-sacrifice. God's power appears when reconciliation replaces revenge, restoration replaces punishment, and justice is afforded to the oppressed or forgotten.

Meditation: While God's power may at times appear overwhelming, it is most often *underwhelming*, sometimes barely noticeable, when compared with typical political and economic power. In your experience, how does God exercise power in ways that are unexpected?

Prayer: Good and gracious Shepard, open our eyes to see you and our hearts to know you.
